Dear Prime Minister:

We, the Cambodians, who desire real Peace, Freedom, and Democracy in Cambodia and around the world, would like to express our deepest gratitude and appreciation to the Government of Denmark and Danish citizens who pay attention to Human Rights violations and to the political situation in Cambodia. We would like to have a chance to establish the Khmer National Liberation Front in Denmark to fight for Peace, Freedom, and Democracy and to seek justice for our people.

We have the great honor of informing you, that after meeting with Mr. Michael Aastrup Jensen, member of the Danish parliament at Christiansborg on April 19th, 2012 and a meeting with Ambassador Mikael Hemniti Winther at the Danish Embassy in Thailand on August 22nd, 2012, we have established the Khmer National Liberation Front in Denmark on December 12th, 2012. We would like to acquaint you with our declarations.

We, the Khmer National Liberation Front, which represents Cambodians who desire Peace, Freedom and Democracy, know that Denmark is a good country that promotes Peace, Freedom, Democracy, Independence and Justice and especially pays attention to Human Rights around the world. We are therefore very happy to be good friends of Denmark and other Democratic Countries. We desire Cambodia to be a Democratic Country like Denmark, the European Union and the United States of America.

Mrs. Prime Minister, Cambodia are facing severe human rights and freedom rights violations and Paris Peace Agreement violations committed by dictator Hun Sen and Vietnam; they put pressure against Cambodians through threats on people lives, killings, imprisonments, forced evictions and land grabbing, natural values are destroyed such as forests, ore and fish.

The European Community, the President of The United States of America, Mr. Barack Obama, and Mr. Surya Subedi, reporter of the United Nations recently expressed their concern on the basis of human rights, the violation of freedom rights and crimes against Cambodians. We would like to draw to your attention the following:

1. The "Cambodian People Party," a party that has been ruling Cambodia since 1979 to present, is a group of former Khmer Communists. The Vietnamese established this group of communists on June 28, 1951. Called the "Khmer Viet Minh," they worked together with the Khmer Rouge to make the killing field regime. They are a branch of the Indochinese Communist Federation, established on February 3, 1930. The "Cambodian People Party," which is a group of "Khmer Viet Minh," or "Khmer Rouge," now rules the regime in Cambodia. Hun Sen, Chea Sim and Heng Samrin were former Khmer Rouge Leaders and commanded in the Pol Pot regime in the "Killing Fields," from April 1975-July 1977 and are currently the top leaders of this dictatorship now. These criminals of humanity should be brought to trial.
2. On January 7, 1979, Cambodia came under Vietnamese Occupation and was ruled by the "Cambodian People Party," lead by Hun Sen, Chea Sim and Heng Samrin until 1989. During that period of time, hundreds of thousands of people has been condemned to death and forced to work hard in the jungle, without food and medicine. Many were killed by land mines and malaria; that was the implementation of the deadly K5 plan from 1982 to 1988. Some Vietnamese soldiers did not withdraw from Cambodia; they camouflaged themselves as civilians and infiltrate the Cambodian People Party even in present day.
3. In 1993, there was a historic election prepared by UNTAC. In that election the FUNCINPEC were victorious but the "Cambodian People Party," rejected the results of the election only allowing the FUNCINPEC to share power with them. On July 5-6, 1997, the Cambodian People Party staged a bloody coup to take control of the government causing the death of 300 democrats. Unfair and rigged elections continue till this day. The majority of Khmer citizens did not agree with the election; they protested against the CPP party in 1998 but they were severely cracked down on. Some were killed and some went missing.
4. On March 30, 1997, a grenade attack by a group supported by Hun Sen's bodyguards killed sixteen people and injured one hundred. Since the time of incident, the government has never found and punished the criminals.
5. Many members of the opposition party were imprisoned and killed for working for their party. Union Leaders and Journalists have also been jailed and even murdered for freely expressing and speaking out against the government. The dictator regime's "authorities" suspiciously never arrested the perpetrators.
6. On 20 June 2006, Hun Sen's authorities led by Police Chief Hok Longdy shot and killed 10 prisoners and one policeman in Battambang prison.
7. On November 22, 2010, around 400 people were killed on Koh Pich Bridge but the authorities closed the case immediately and did not allow further investigations to find the true cause of the tragedy. Instead, the dictator regime turned to threaten and arrest whoever dared to mention the incident.
8. The Cambodian people are having food poison at different places across the country, and the workers in the factories were poisoned at many places, but there is no investigation.
9. Land eviction and land grabbing has spread across the country depriving victims of the basic bare essentials of food and shelter. If the people that lived on the land did not comply with orders to leave, the "authorities" beat and shot them.

10. The dictator authorities arrested and imprisoned innocent people amongst them Buddhist monks charging them for distributing leaflets without concrete evidence.

We would also call to your attention the continuous violations of the Paris Peace Treaty of 1991 by Vietnam and present dictatorial Cambodian government led by Hun Sen.

We refer to article 8 of the Paris Peace Treaty. Addressing the withdrawal of foreign forces out of Cambodia, it is stated that "*Immediately upon entry into force of this Agreement, any foreign forces, advisers, and military personnel remaining in Cambodia, together with their weapons, ammunition, and equipment, shall be withdrawn from Cambodia and not be returned. Such withdrawal and non-return will be subject to UNTAC verification in accordance with annex 2*". However, Vietnam currently continues to violate this agreement by hiding both Vietnamese agents, disguised as civilians, and uniformed soldiers who exist in Cambodia with the full support of Hun Sen's Cambodian People's Party (CPP).

There is much injustice for the Cambodian people, whom have been murdered and imprisoned for speaking up for their rights to live freely. No perpetrators have been arrested and punished for their crimes. The "Cambodian People Party", Hun Sen and his master the Vietnamese, are responsible for all the crimes against humanity and severe human rights abuse, committed in Cambodia since 1979 to present day.

Therefore, we have established the Khmer National Liberation Front to have a voice to ask the Government of Denmark for help and support and to help bring our issues to the European Union, the international scene and the United Nations. We would like to ask your government not to recognize the present government led by dictator Hun Sen and take any effective action against this regime.

We would like to wish you all the best during Christmas and the coming New Year.
